



## Registration

There are two ways to register for the Fall 2026 Semester.

**Online Classes:** A student must register online at [www.labts.org](http://www.labts.org) for online classes. Several methods of payments are available.

**In-person Classes:** The registration for in-person classes can be done online at [www.labts.org](http://www.labts.org). This is highly recommended. An alternative is to register on the first day of the in-person class. Registration will be held one hour prior to the start of the first day of class. Methods of payments that will be accepted are cash, check, or debit/credit card.

**Costs:** The registration fee is \$100.00 per course. The fee is non-refundable unless the course is cancelled. There is an additional cost for the textbook assigned for each class. The textbook for online classes must be purchased as a part of registration. Students who are taking an in-person class will purchase the textbook on the first day of class.
